Sales Tax Holiday

It's almost "back-to-school" time and for ten days (Saturday, August 4 through Monday, August 13) there will be no Florida State Sales Tax on children's clothing & shoes, books, and school supplies (pens, paper, tape, disks, etc.).

There are price limits for the tax exemption: clothing or books must normally sell for under \$50 and school supply items must be under \$10.

School starts again on Monday, August 20.

BIG CYPRESS TRAILS OPEN TO ORVs

Cypress National Preserve Superintendent Karen Gustin announced that effective Friday, August 3, the off-road vehicle (ORV) trails within the Preserve will reopen to all recreational permitted users. The trails are reopening after a sixty-day closure that began in June. The required closure is under the Preserve's ORV Management Plan to allow for a resting period of reduced ORV use within the area. (see the Rapper, May 25, 2007)

Superintendent Gustin said, "With the reopening of the trail system, we hope that everyone has a safe and enjoyable ORV season."

CITY COUNCIL

A special meeting of the City Council was convened on Tuesday, July 31, to set the millage rate and the dates for special hearings on the budget. These will be on Tuesday, September 4, and Thursday, September 13, at 5:30 p.m. in City Hall.

There will be a full City Council meeting on **Tuesday**, **August 7**, at 5:30 p.m. Mayor Sammy Hamilton told the *Rapper* that he has not been idle during the three-month break since the last regular meeting. The FEMA audit is almost ready to sign off, way ahead of the time it normally takes to prepare one. He is working on the Comprehensive Plan for the City and hopes to get some grants.

As for the millage, it has been set at 1.9558, which is slightly lower than last year. He said that in his 12 years in office, he has tried to keep the millage low to help local people. Under the new Property Tax Reform legislation which came into effect this spring, the State determines the maximum millage that can be set by calculating a Compound Annual Growth Rate from the population and tax income in 2001 and 2006. Ours was only 7.46%. Unlike other counties and municipalities, Everglades City has not suffered under this regime because the millage has always been kept low. For comparison, the Collier County millage will be set at 3.15, down from 3.58 mils last year.







Swamp Tales



Have you ever wondered about alligators? I have. There's a really big one at the Seafood Depot in Everglades City in the bar to the right of the front lobby. It had to have been one bad dude. An alligator is a large, semi-aquatic, carnivorous reptile that has four legs and a huge tail. If you look at the tail, which is the rear business end of a gator you will see it is half the animal's length. The gator tail helps push an alligator through the water and is used as a very dangerous weapon. The tail is also used to make pools of water during the dry seasons, which we call gator holes out here in the Everglades. The gator tail also stores fat that the alligator may use for nourishment during the winter season. They are cold blooded, pre-historic creatures 250 million years old and they do not make their own body heat. They gain body heat by basking in the sun. That is why you see them along the banks of canals in the Ten Thousand Islands or on the banks of canals along the Tamiami Trail. My advice to you is to stay far away from an alligator. They are really fast on land and can run about 11 MPH. They can do a hunkered-down body crawl between 3 and 6 MPH. And you sure don't want to try to out swim a gator because they can do a little over 6 MPH in the water. My advice to you is to leave them alone. They really can become mean dudes in no time at all. Meanwhile, enjoy eating some delicious fried gator tail during your visit to the Everglades of Florida. That's as close as you want to get to a gator tail!



F.W.C. NEWS

The most likely fatal boating accident will occur during July,

between 4:00 and 6:00 p.m. in a small (under 18-foot) boat operated by a male between 36 and 50 years old in a river or creek when it collides with another vessel or a fixed object; the cause of death will be drowning by a person not wearing a life jacket.

The FWC recently released its statistics for 2006. In Florida, there were 600 accidents during the year, 69 of which were fatal; Monroe County had the most accidents in the state.

WHY IS IT CALLED "HUSTON" RIVER?



Off the Shelf - Florida Fiction

Fans of Travis Magee are missing something if they have not read "Condominium". Author John D. MacDonald writes flowing, descriptive prose punctuated with pithy messages about the condition of Florida and the newcomers who try to mold it into their own version of paradise. Of course, that has been happening since Disston started draining the swamp and continues to this day with pristine gated communities.

Published in 1977, this novel dwells on shortcuts in condo construction, the destruction of natural habitats, and human morality. In the end, nature in the form of a hurricane, sorts out the baddies from the goodies.

Another of his books, "A Flash of Green", has a similar theme - corruption and despoliation – and was just as well-written back in 1962 when he comments "People down here despise natural beauty. It seems to make them terrible uneasy. The don't really feel secure until they can see asphalt in every direction, and they don't trust a tree unless they've grown it themselves."

Carl Hiaasen and other Florida writers pay tribute to MacDonald but none, in my view, has come close to his depth of perception about the Florida scene, nor to his fluent verbiage.
